2022 CCNet Coach Certification Process is Open!

We are happy to announce that the next round of coach certification, the program of 2nd party coach certification (CCNet certifying its own coaches) that has occurred for the last few years is now open.

The idea is not to be too exclusive (everyone who is acting as a Conservation Standards coach can still call themselves a coach whether you're certified or not), but to offer a higher level of assurance to those who want/need it. Again, note that one does not need to be certified to act as a coach – the vast majority of coaches are not certified – certification is intended for those who would like:

- The acknowledgement of their peers;
- Professional recognition that you are a skilled leader in the Conservation Standards;
- Eventually, we hope & believe, preferential hiring.

The application process is not trivial, and involves the detailed documentation of your coach training and experience. So as not to overwhelm the small pool of voluntary reviewers, we are capping the number of applications at 15 for this 2022 round.

There are also fees involved. You would want to get your application in by the end

Description: The Nature-based Solutions learning initiative aimed to understand the value of a Nature-based Solutions approach for achieving cost effective benefits for biodiversity, climate, and society. Guide to Watershed Connectivity Remediation Planning

The Canadian Wildlife Federation developed <u>a practitioner's guide</u> for addressing barriers to freshwater connectivity. This adaptation of the Conservation Standards would work particularly well in situations where was a practitioner's guide to designing, measuring, and monitoring site-based conservation projects. But conservation has increasingly required working at larger scales and in more complex systems. So they wrote Pathways to Success as a guide to practical analytical frameworks and tools used by conservation program managers and funders who want to increase the scope and effectiveness of their work. Just as Measures of Success helped catalyze two decades of work around the Open Standards for the Practice of Conservation, the authors hope Pathways to Success will help frame the space of inquiry for conservation practice in the years to come.
