In Memoriam



With a heavy heart we share that former CCNet Board Chair, Brad Northrup, passed on peacefully and surrounded by love on May 26, 2022. All of us at CCNet mourn the loss of this great man, and send our deep condolences to his family.

Brad was instrumental in the birth of the Conservation Standards (through his contributions to the early work with 5S/CAP) as well as the Efroymson Coaches Network (which became CCNet), and the Conservation Measures Partnership. Brad always believed in the value of capacity building, sharing, and learning across cultures, organizations, and

geographies. He was one of the first people in The Nature Conservancy to venture into international conservation. When Brad retired from The Nature Conservancy after years of extraordinary service in almost every level of the organization, he graciously agreed to serve as CCNet's first official chairperson. It would be almost impossible to exaggerate the value that he brought to this role and to our community. He held our community values up high, steered us through uncertain waters, led our strategic planning process, diligently worked to ensure we had operating funds, led us through a significant growth spurt in coaches, and welcomed new regional networks. He was ever humble and warmly received everyone as a peer. He was always eager to learn from all of us and believed that each and every one of us can make a difference with our abilities as coaches. CCNet could have had no better cheerleader, champion, friend, example, mentor, father, or chairperson.

Brad used to say that "what fuels CCNet is generosity." To honor his legacy we have decided to name our service awards in his name, and at the upcoming CCNet Rally in Canada we will announce the recipients of the "Brad Northrup Global Service Award". Please join us by expressing gratitude for Brad's life, years of service, and help us honor his legacy by sharing your talents for our collective good, by keeping the flame of our community values alive, and by fostering innovation, excellence, and a culture of cooperation.

Applying the Conservation Standards (and adaptions of) with Indigenous People – seeking examples of successful planning and engagement.

CCNet's Community of Practice CS Projects on Indigenous Land and Waters is undertaking a project on "Scaling of indigenous-led conservation using the Conservation Standards". The project seeks to identify and explore pathways for scaling the use of the CS by indigenous land and sea managers. Recent successes at scaling CS and its adaptations in multiple places around the world (e.g. Healthy Country Planning in Australia) have led this project to look at the contributing factors for this uptake and growth and compare these with the context and circumstances in other world regions.

The project will investigate the enablers and barriers to scaling indigenous ledconservation using the CS through a series of dialogues, interviews, case studies, and workshops (virtual or inperson) to develop theories of change for key strategies to scale Indigenous-led conservation. While this project is primarily focused on indigenous-led conservation, it also recognizes the role that local communities play in the preservation of natural and cultural

Consultancy Opportunity on Performance and Impact Monitoring

<u>Costa Rica por Siempre</u> is looking for a monitoring and evaluation consultant for the BRIDGE project, which helps RedLAC (the network of environmental funds of Latin America and the Caribbean) and CAFÉ (a similar network of environmental funds in Africa) develop innovative finance mechanisms to involve the private sector in contributing to 2030 goals. The project has a monitoring and evaluation plan. The consultant would receive about US\$5,000 to \$10,000 to help with:

- 1. Reviewing indicators and defining target levels for each indicator
- 2. Gathering information from RedLAC and CAFE members to measure their baseline level of private sector resources and the number of economic sectors with which they work
- Providing advice on how to calibrate targets with regard to the baseline
- 4. Advising monitoring frequency
- 5. Developing a dashboard (Excel matrix or equivalent) to support data management

In this online training workshop, you will learn skills to help you create effective strategies for conservation projects of any type or size. The workshop covers how to assess the current situation you are trying to change, plan the impact you want to achieve, plan the work you will carry out to achieve that impact, and adapt your strategy to your needs and situation. The workshop combines weekly live teaching sessions and pre-recorded training videos. The workshop is run over 6 weeks, with an average of 4 hours of learning per week.

In this online training workshop, you will learn how to to select the stakeholders that are right for your project, initiate the relationship to build trust and understanding, formalise the relationship to set expectations, and manage the relationship to progress the project and adapt to changing conditions. The workshop combines weekly live teaching sessions and pre-recorded training videos. It runs over 5 weeks, with an average of 3 hours of learning per week.
